

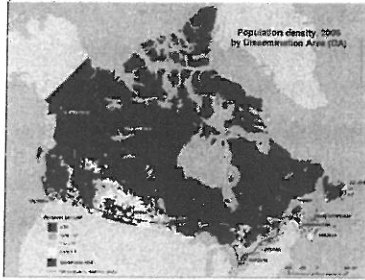
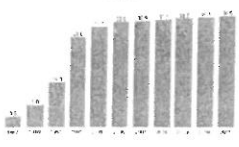

- Canada's population has slowed in recent years, but is still increasing.

Population of Canada since Confederation, 1867-2011

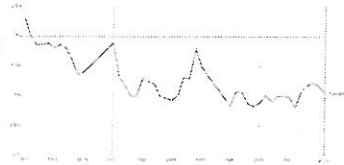


1. Canada is 2nd largest country in the world, but only makes up 0.5% of the total pop. what factors might lower its carrying capacity?

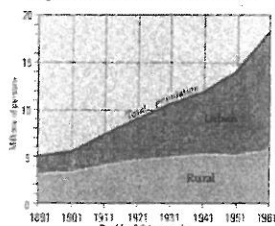
5. In 2012 most Canadians lived in Ont., Que., BC and Alberta. Why do you think this is so?

Populations: Urban vs. Rural



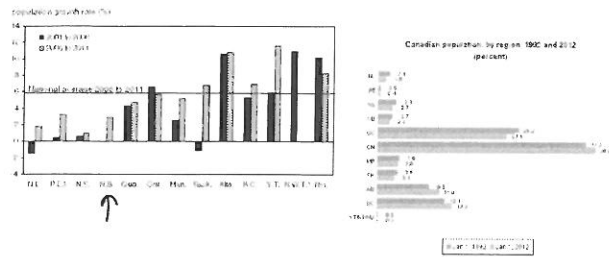

Population in New Brunswick

- NB has a population of 751,171 with an increasing growth rate after many decades of decreasing rates.
